





- **Certificate of completion**

What is Certification?

CERTIFY – to attest authoritatively as meeting a standard.

Webster's Ninth Collegiate Dictionary

- Professional credential
- Competency assessment
- Third-party validation of the four 'E's
- Voluntary process

- Evaluates individuals against a standard
- Requires continuing education and professional development (recertification)

| Typically requires some amount of professional experience | For newcomers and experienced professionals alike |
| Awarded by a third-party, standard-setting organization | Awarded by a training and educational programs or institutions |
| Indicates <u>master/competency</u> , as measured against a defensible set of standards, usually by application or examination | Indicates <u>completion of a course</u> or series of courses with a specific focus |
| Typically results in a designation to use after one's name | Usually listed on a resume detailing education |
| Has <u>on-going requirements</u> (<u>recertification/continuing education</u>) to maintain; holder must demonstrate he/she continues to meet requirements | Is the end result; individual may or may not need to demonstrate knowledge of course content at the end of a set period of time |



Salary Survey 2020

- Joint effort led by BCSP and National Safety Council (NSC)
- 9,225 responses
- Median annual base salary: \$98,000

Findings:

- Certified SH&E professionals typically earn \$17,700 MORE per year than those with no licenses or certifications
- CSP is <u>higher</u>: \$27,700 more per year*





Accreditation — the formal recognition by an independent body, generally known as an accreditation body, that a certification body operates according to international standards

International Organization for Standardization (ISO)

What are the STS/STSC Certifications

- Certification for leaders at all levels of an organization.
 - All employees are responsible for a safe work
 environment
 - Intended for executives, directors, managers, supervisors, superintendents, and employees
 - May not have safety as a primary duty, but their knowledge ensures safer worksites

Training Requirement

• 30 hours of formal safety-related training

Experience Requirement

- Two (2) years supervisory experience; OR
- Four (4) years work experience (work experience must be a minimum part-time [18 hrs/week] to qualify); OR
- An associate degree or higher in Occupational Safety, Risk Management, or Construction Management; OR
- Completion of a 2-year trade or union training program/apprenticeship.

Ethics

Commitment to the BCSP Code of Ethics



Attend and/or teach 30 hours during the five-year cycle

- Safety and health courses
- Presentations
- Tool-box talks

OR

Achieve the CSP, SMS, ASP, OHST, CHST, STS, STSC, or CIT during the five-year cycle
